

Criteria for membership of the Research,

Development and Innovation Committee 2022

As an 'expert' committee, membership of the Research, Development and Innovation Committee is subject to a process of nomination or self-nomination by members of the Royal College of Podiatry, followed by a selection process adopting the criteria outlined below.

Nominees may be eligible for membership of the RDI Committee if they are able to satisfy the criteria for one of the following categories.

Experienced researchers

At least 30 research publications Have held single research grants of a value greater than £200,000 MPhil, PhD or Prof Doc. Professorial status Demonstrably active in podiatry throughout the previous 5 years

Career researchers

At least 10 research publications Have held single research grants of a value greater than £40,000 MPhil, PhD or Prof Doc.

New researchers

Currently at least three years or more into a PhD study, or have completed a PhD within the last five years At least one research publication

"Core" Podiatrists with research interests

MPhil, PhD or Prof Doc Working predominantly in podiatry practice for five years or more At least two research publications

Podiatric surgeons with research interests

Qualified Podiatric surgeon MPhil, PhD or Prof Doc At least two research publications

Biomechanics specialists with research interests

MPhil, PhD or Prof Doc Biomechanics qualification or working predominantly in biomechanics for five years or more At least two research publications

Podiatry managers with research interests

Head or Deputy Head of podiatry service MPhil, PhD or Prof Doc At least two research publications

Podiatry educators with research interests

Working predominantly in podiatry education for five years or more MPhil, PhD or Prof Doc At least five research publications

Private practitioners with research interests

Working predominantly in private practice MPhil, PhD or Prof Doc At least two research publications

Statement of Principle

Members who are selected to serve on the Research, Development and Innovation Committee must abide by the following Statement of Principle:

As a member of the Research, Development and Innovation Committee, each individual should:

- Endeavour to attend at least two of the scheduled meetings of the Committee each year
- Be prepared to serve the interests of the wider membership and those of the Royal College of Podiatry
- Acknowledge the need to serve the broader interests and needs of the profession and the Royal College of Podiatry and not to serve or promote those of particular sectional or interest groups
- Undertake to demonstrate mutual respect for other members of the Research, Development and Innovation Committee
- *Be prepared to contribute and actively participate in the duties and commitments of the* Research, Development and Innovation Committee
- Undertake not to disclose confidential information arising from the business of the Research, Development and Innovation Committee
- Allow everyone to take part in committee meetings without interruption or intimidation, and to treat everyone equally
